Spots will be honored on a first-come, first served basis. A spot on Team Minnesota is secured only after you complete the 2024 application and submit your non-refundable \$500 deposit. If you have multiple athletes, one application is required to be completed for each individual athlete. Team Minnesota's Delegation Head will contact you via email upon receiving your athlete's application regarding availability on the team and how to make the deposit. If there are no available spots on Team Minnesota, your athlete(s) will be added to Team Minnesota's waitlist. After submitting your application and deposit, you will receive information about additional registration steps that include completing your athlete's online profile through JCC Association of North America.

What are The JCC Maccabi Games®?

The JCC Maccabi Games®, a weeklong, Olympic-style sports competition, is hosted each summer by one or several communities throughout North America. The Games have brought more than 180,000 teen athletes together for one-week summer events in host communities throughout North America since 1982. Each year teen participants in these programs from more than 100 JCCs and communities across North America and around the world connect to explore their identities, develop lasting memories and friendships, and to work together to make a real difference in the Jewish world.

The JCC Maccabi® brand programs offer Jewish teens the chance to give something back to their communities through JCC Cares, as well as the ability for many to feel, for the first time, part of Am Yisrael, a sense of connection to the global Jewish community. The weeklong program includes athletic competition, cultural activities, and a community service component as well as evening social activities.

Athletes 12-16 can compete against Jewish teens from all over the United States as well as delegations from Israel, Great Britain, Mexico, Canada, and more! The games are played with a focus on "rachmanus" or sportsmanship with the intent to foster long-lasting memories and identification with Judaism and Israel.

This unique event is not only about being a part of the Jewish people; it comes with a mission—to make the world a better place and to make ourselves better people. We express these values or midot to help us remember the greater mission of JCC Maccabi® and Judaism. We emphasize Tikkun Olam (repairing the world), Kavod (respect), Rina (joy), Ga'ava (pride), Lev Tov (big hearted), and Amiut Yehudit (Jewish peoplehood) while promoting community involvement, and teamwork.

- Evening social events
- Home hospitality with local Jewish host families or hotel accommodations with your delegation

Participant Eligibility

JCC Association of North America policy states: JCC Maccabi® Games are for Jewish Athletes who are between the ages of 12-16 as of July 31, 2024. All athletes must be Jewish which is defined as follows: One of the athlete's parents is Jewish and the athlete is being raised Jewish or is a Jew by choice and is being raised Jewish. In the spirit of JCC Maccabi if the parent or child does not believe that they are Jewish on a year around basis, then the child should not participate in JCC Maccabi programs. In the athlete registration, there is a declaration that contains the eligibility requirements; both the athlete and his/ her parent(s) must sign this declaration. All athletes must have current medical insurance and be up to date on all age-appropriate vaccines as per CDC guidelines.

**All participants must agree and adhere to the Minnesota JCC and JCC Association of North America policies to be eligible to participate.*

Minnesota JCC Financial Policy - Additional Fees, Cancellations, and Refunds

Total cost per athlete: \$1,500.00 **this includes airfare plus 1 checked bag, accommodations, uniforms, Team Minnesota gear, backpack, food, entertainment, etc.*

It is encouraged to pay in full, otherwise there will be three (3) payment installments as described below.

**Deposit amount will be based on the date application is submitted*

1. Nonrefundable deposit of \$500 per athlete due upon submitting athlete application
2. Second installment of \$500 per athlete due February 1, 2024 and will be automatically charged to the card on file
3. Third installment of \$500 due March 1, 2024 and will be automatically charged to the card on file

In the event that a payment deadline is not met, you will be contacted by a representative of the Minnesota JCC and must respond within two (2) business days to complete the payment. If the Minnesota JCC is not able to contact you after two (2) business days, the Minnesota JCC reserves the right to replace the athlete with another eligible teen.

Additional Fees

Team Minnesota participants and parents/guardians are financially responsible for any late fees that Team Minnesota acquires from JCC Association of North America as a result of not meeting ANY registration deadlines outlined by the Minnesota JCC and JCC Association of North America.

Team Minnesota participant(s) are strongly encouraged to travel with the delegation. Participant(s) and parents/guardians are financially responsible for airline fees, including the checked bag fee and new ticket cost, if they require a change in travel itinerary after February 1, 2024. The participants' parent(s)/guardian(s) will also be responsible for arranging the new travel itinerary and logistics and submitting it to Team Minnesota's delegation head.

Cancellations and Refunds

A full refund will be issued if the Minnesota JCC makes the decision to no longer participate in the 2024 JCC Maccabi Games at any time.

The deposit made upon submitting the application is nonrefundable. If your cancellation is received by February 29, 2024, you are eligible for a refund of up to \$1,000.00. Any cancellations received after February 29, 2024 will not be eligible for a refund.

In the instance that an athlete unexpectedly withdraws from the Team Minnesota delegation as a result of a medical reason and cancels registration after March 1, 2024, they may be eligible for a medical refund of \$400.00. In order to receive a \$400.00 refund, the parent(s)/guardian(s) must provide a signed and dated doctor's note on or before August 5, 2024. The note must include the athlete's name and nature of the injury. If the medical drop is COVID related, it must be because of a positive COVID-19 test that prevents participation in the start of the Games. Proof of the positive COVID-19 test must be provided to the Team Minnesota delegation head. No medical refund will be given for apprehension of participating.

All cancellation requests must be submitted in writing to Team Minnesota's delegation head.

JCC Maccabi 2024 Eligibility Requirements

In order to participate in the 2024 JCC Maccabi Games, all teens must be:

- A. Between the ages of 12-16 as of July 31, 2024.
- B. All athletes must be Jewish, which is defined as follows: One of the athlete's parents is Jewish and the athlete is being raised Jewish or is a Jew by choice and is being raised Jewish. In the spirit of the Games, if the parent or child does not believe that they are Jewish on a year-round basis, then the child should not participate in JCC Maccabi. In the athlete online registration, there is a declaration that contains the eligibility requirements; both the athlete and his/her parents(s)/guardian(s) must sign this declaration.
- C. All athletes must have current medical insurance and are up to date on all age-appropriate vaccines as per CDC guidelines.

To reaffirm, all athletes eligible to participate in the 2024 JCC Maccabi Games must be between the ages of 12-16 as of July 31, 2024, Jewish, have current medical insurance, and are up to date on all age-appropriate vaccinations.

Team Minnesota 2024 JCC Maccabi Teen and Parent Code of Conduct

All participants must adhere to the Code of Conduct while participating with the 2024 JCC Maccabi Team Minnesota Delegation.

Participant:

- I will attend all required JCC Maccabi functions leading up to, and while attending, the 2024 JCC Maccabi Experience
- I will respect my coaches, chaperones, teammates, opponents, officials, parents, spectators and Delegation Heads.
- I will not strike, push, threaten to strike, or otherwise physically or verbally intimidate another participant, official, or spectator before, during or after a JCC Maccabi experience activity.
- I will not use rough tactics during the course of a game, practice, or other event.
- I will not engage in an abusive, verbal attack upon any individual while participating in or leading up to the 2024 JCC Maccabi Experience.
- I will not use trash talk, profane, obscene or vulgar language, under any circumstances.
- I will not engage in unsportsmanlike conduct such as throwing equipment or any other forceful action at any time.
- I will always accept and abide by the decision of all officials associated with the JCC Maccabi Experience.
- I will not use tobacco products; consume alcoholic beverages and/or drugs, except for the appropriate use of over-the-counter or prescribed medications.
- I will not engage in any “sexual activity”, including but not limited to groping, exposure, or other sexual acts.
- I will not engage in any non-consensual sexual activity or intimate contact, both physical and verbal, that is forced without someone’s consent.
- I will abide by the rules of the JCC and respect all JCC property at all times.
- I will not drive any vehicle at any time during JCC Maccabi.
- I will conduct myself in a manner consistent with Jewish values and traditions of sportsmanship and kindness to others.

Parent/Guardian:

- I confirm my child meets the eligibility criteria to participate in JCC Maccabi- they are between the ages of 12-16 as of July 31, 2024, Jewish, and are up to date on all vaccinations as required by the CDC.
- I understand that my full deposit of \$500 is NONREFUNDABLE and all fees charged after deposit are NONREFUNDABLE.
- I understand that a portion of the balance of my payment is only refundable if my child has a medical injury and is not cleared to TRAVEL to JCC Maccabi by his/her doctor. In the case that the teen participant is not cleared for travel, I will provide documentation from his/her doctor stating they are not cleared for travel. The balance is NOT refundable if the Teen is cleared to

travel, but not cleared to participate in athletic competition. I understand that I will not receive a full refund and can only receive funds that can be reconciled.

- I understand that if my child's online registration and registration paperwork are not completed by April 1, 2024, I will be responsible for any late fees that Team Minnesota acquires from JCC Association of North America.
- I understand that if my child's medical form and vaccination record is not completed by a doctor and submitted by April 1, 2024, I will be responsible for any late fees that Team Minnesota acquires from JCC Association of North America.
- I understand that if my child's full balance has not been paid by March 1, 2024, my child will forfeit their spot on Team Minnesota, and we will not receive a refund.
- I recognize the importance of volunteer coaches/chaperones. They are very important to the development of my child and the sport. I will communicate with them and support them.
- I will not make negative remarks or gestures to the opposing team, coaches, officials or spectators. I understand that parents/spectators are subject to having technical fouls called by an official on their team for negative comments.
- I will encourage good sportsmanship by demonstrating positive support for all participants and officials at all times.
- I will create a safe and healthy environment for my child that is free from drugs, tobacco, alcohol and abusive language, and I will refrain from their use at all JCC Maccabi events.
- I will remember that the game is for the athlete and not the parents.
- I will review the JCC Maccabi Code of Conduct with my teen upon registration, and make sure they are prepared to abide by all JCC Maccabi policies.
- I understand that the Minnesota JCC Maccabi Delegation reserves the right to revoke the privilege of any participant to be a member of Team Minnesota if the teen or teen's family does not exhibit appropriate conduct or otherwise fails to meet the obligations set forth in this agreement. Destructive and/or disruptive behavior will not be tolerated and may result in immediate dismissal from the team and as a member of the Minnesota JCC. No fees will be refunded upon dismissal.

Non-adherence to the above stated Parent and Teen Participation Agreement will result in disciplinary action to be determined on a case-by-case basis.

2024 JCC Maccabi Vaccination Policy

All athletes wishing to participate in JCC Maccabi must be up to date with the following age-appropriate vaccines recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) and the Center for Disease Control (CDC).

Athlete will have to upload proof of vaccinations in CampDoc. PLEASE NOTE – there has been a shift in the required vs. Recommended vaccines since 2023.

Required vaccinations are:

- Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis)
- IPV (Poliovirus)
- **Hib (Haemophilus influenzae type b bacteria)**
- **PCV 13 (Pneumococcal) vaccine or PCV 23**
- MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella) or serologic evidence of immunity
- Meningococcal vaccine – age 11 and again at age 16 (5 year interval)
- **Hepatitis B – if required by the state that the Games is taking place in (in order to attend public school)**

Recommended, but not required:

- COVID-19 and current available booster
- Hepatitis A
- Influenza (flu)

JCC Maccabi reserves the right to update this policy at any time and without prior notice. Please see the [CDC's vaccine schedule](#) for more information.

Policy Exceptions: There will be no exceptions to the vaccination policy granted in 2024, however, if your child is interested in following the catch up schedule to be able to participate this summer – please find all of the necessary information on page 3 [here](#).

COVID-19 Safety Protocols

As of November 5, 2023, JCC Maccabi will not require the COVID-19 vaccine in order to participate in the 2024 JCC Maccabi Games and Access, however JCC Maccabi strongly recommends and encourages all eligible participants to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19, as vaccinations offer substantial protection against infection, transmission, hospitalization, and death from the COVID-19 virus.

Please note: our vaccination policy and protocols surrounding COVID-19 are subject to change at any time. JCC Maccabi reserves the right to add additional requirements and other health and safety precautions including, but not limited to, testing, mask wearing, physical distancing, up to and including canceling the Games if necessary.

It is required that each participant and the participant's guardian electronically sign this waiver as a part of the participant's online registration, acknowledging the risks inherent with participating in a large-scale event.

Please carefully read the following information and agree to the terms outlined below.

COVID-19 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

The undersigned participant and parent/guardian understand and agree to the following:

- 1. As COVID-19 and its multiple variants, will remain for the foreseeable future, this event may be interrupted or canceled.*
- 2. If participant registers for this event and then cancels due to concerns about COVID-19, but the event is held, registration fees are non-refundable.*
- 3. Participant understands that they are participating in a large-scale event that will take place over several locations, including crowds and enclosed spaces in which they will be in close contact with other participants. As such, the participant will do everything possible to reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 leading up and including the week of the Games.*
- 4. The following COVID-19 recommendations and protocols have been established and participant understands the recommendations set forth by JCC Maccabi: JCC Maccabi strongly recommends participants be fully vaccinated and up to date with the most recent COVID-19 booster as per the CDC guidance.*
- 5. Participant agrees that: if participants are vaccinated, they will be asked to provide proof of vaccination. Participants that do not have proof of vaccination will be allowed to participate but may be subject to different testing/quarantine requirements.*

6. Participants will be required to adhere to all COVID-19 related protocols that are put in place, including but not limited to masking, testing, vaccinations, physical distancing and quarantining. Detailed protocols will be communicated closer to the date of the event and may be changed or modified by event organizers at any time without advanced notice.

7. JCC Maccabi reserves the right to test any participant showing symptoms of COVID-19.

The undersigned participant and parent/guardian further understand and agree to the following provisions that will apply if a participant is diagnosed with COVID-19 while at the JCC Maccabi Games:

- The delegation head, in consultation with the host JCC and JCC Association of North America, is authorized to and will ensure appropriate medical care is sought and follow local and state health quarantine guidelines.
- Participant's parent/guardian will be notified and will be required to come to the host city as soon as possible but no later than 48 hours after being notified of the situation. Upon arrival, participant will be released into the care of their parent/guardian.
- Any and all additional expenses incurred as a result of a COVID-19 diagnosis will be the responsibility of participant's parent/guardian, including but not limited to all medical expenses, quarantine accommodations, and alternative travel arrangements.

UNCONDITIONAL RELEASE OF LIABILITY

The undersigned hereby unconditionally releases the sponsoring Jewish Community Center and the Jewish Community Centers Association of North America, Maccabi World Union, Maccabi USA, Maccabi Canada, and any other sponsoring organizations (collectively the "Sponsors") and the Sponsors officers, directors, executives, employees, agents, volunteers, and anyone working under, through or in connection with any of them, of any liability for or with respect to any incident, claim, occurrence, loss, injury, or damage, whether known or unknown, present or future, foreseeable or not, that could or may arise out of any COVID-19 related issue (including, by way of illustration and not limitation, all items noted previously in the Agreement), from the time when participant shall leave their permanent residence until the time when participant shall have returned thereto.

The undersigned hereby acknowledge that they are executing this instrument with the full knowledge of the purpose and effect of the contents hereof, that they have had the opportunity to seek legal advice and counsel of their own choosing, and that they execute the same freely and voluntarily, and on the basis that this instrument cannot be altered or revoked except in a writing approved and signed by them and an authorized officer of the sponsoring Jewish Community Center and of JCC Association of North America.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the athletic competition like?

The competitive level of the participants will vary. There are teens that are elite athletes and then those that are there for the experience, the level of play is very diverse. Some of the sports will have different divisions based on skill levels. Throughout the week, players can expect to play at least four games/matches before tournament play begins on Wednesday. Gold, silver and bronze medals are awarded to the top three winners. Although it is competitive the JCC Maccabi Games emphasize the Rachmanus Rule, which is good sportsmanship and fair play. The experience is about more than just sports. It focuses on an all-around experience including friends, community service, social and educational activities.

1. What is a delegation?

Teens from across North American participate in JCC Maccabi representing their 'local' delegation. Typically, this is the delegation represent their home city/local JCC for example Team Atlanta, Team Philadelphia, Team Toronto etc.

2. What is a mixed team?

A mixed team is comprised of athletes from multiple delegations. This is common and happens when a delegation does not have enough athletes to field a full team. Where our delegation is unable to field a full team, athletes will be combined in a mix team with one or more other delegations' players. Being on a mixed team can be a great experience and foster lasting friendships with Jewish teens around the world!

3. How does community service play a role in JCC Maccabi?

Community Service is a key component to the JCC Maccabi Games experience. Each set of Games includes a JCC Cares project where athletes step away from competition and workshops for a part of their day and work to improve the local community, through activities like planting a community garden, bowling with adults with special needs, or doing art projects one-on-one with children from underserved communities.

4. How will my child get to and from the Games?

Parents/guardians will be responsible for bringing athletes to the airport where delegation staff will be there to check teens in and accompany the group to the Games.

5. What is the fee for the JCC Maccabi Games?

The Minnesota JCC is thrilled to be taking a delegation of ten (10) athlete participants to the 2024 Maccabi Games in Detroit!

Detroit: The all-inclusive fee is \$1,500.00 per teen

6. What does the fee include?

JCC Maccabi is an all-inclusive experience. Program fees include Games registration fees, transportation to and from the host community and during the Games, uniform, Team Minnesota gear, adult supervision and coaches, practices, meals, social events/team activities, and all other accommodations throughout the program.

7. Are there scholarships available?

We strongly encourage you to reach out to your local Federation, Jewish Community Foundation, and synagogue to enquire about local funding opportunities.

Limited scholarships are available locally for families in need of financial assistance. All funding is need-based and you can apply through a confidential process. 8. What does registration entail?

Registration includes submitting the completed application through the Minnesota JCC, a \$500 non-refundable deposit paid upon submitting the application, and agreement to the non-refundable remainder of the payment to the Minnesota JCC. Additional registration steps are required at later dates including medical forms, and online registration, roommate requests etc. through JCC Association of North America. Team Minnesota's delegation head will supply detailed information as next steps are required.

9. Are there adult chaperones at JCC Maccabi?

Of course! There is a mandatory ratio of 1:8 adults to teens. In addition to a delegation head, every athlete is assigned to a coach/chaperone whether they are on a team sport, individual sport, or a mixed team with a coach from another delegation. Head coaches are all over 21 and have passed extensive background checks.

10. Where will my teen stay?

In **Detroit**, the week of JCC Maccabi (Sunday-Friday), teens will stay either with a host family or in a hotel with their delegation and fellow athletes, coaches, and delegation heads. Host families are Jewish homes that are part of their greater JCC communities. The hotel experience will be a unique and exciting opportunity to spend time with athletes from their delegation and other athletes from all over North America.

In **Houston**, the week of JCC Maccabi (Sunday-Friday), all teens will stay with a host family. Host families are Jewish homes that are part of their greater JCC communities. Host families are background checked, screened, and required to attend a mandatory orientation. Vaccines will be required for all members of a host family who will be age eligible to receive it. The home hospitality experience is an important part

of the Games experience. We are very gracious to these host families as they serve as interim parents for the week transporting the teens to and from JCC Maccabi, provide breakfast, laundry, and give your teen an unforgettable home hospitality experience. Many teens will stay in touch with host families for years to come!

Teens can request specific homes that meet their needs such as dietary restrictions and pet allergies. Teens can also request a specific roommate. Participants may not arrange their own housing unless approved and discussed by their Delegation Head.

11. Can you tell me about security at JCC Maccabi?

Security is taken very seriously at the JCC Maccabi Games. Background checks are utilized for all adults involved, and all participants, spectators, coaches, host families, volunteers, etc. are required to wear a credential to access any JCC Maccabi facility. The host community also works closely with local, state, and federal law enforcement to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all.

12. Our family keeps kosher and is observant- will my teen's needs be met at JCC Maccabi?

Yes, all food served at the JCC Maccabi Games is kosher, and all activities will conclude prior to Shabbat. Delegations will return home on Friday with plenty of time before Shabbat.

13. Can I use my son or daughter's school or camp medical form for JCC Maccabi?

No. Maccabi Central will only accept the JCC Maccabi Medical Form.

14. What happens if there is a medical emergency?

In the case of a medical emergency, the Delegation Head will act as the participant's guardian and will communicate with the parents to get any treatment necessary. Information such as the parent/guardian's birth date and social security number is sometimes necessary to utilize insurance.

15. Can parents be spectators at the JCC Maccabi Games?

Yes! Parents, family members, and friends are welcome to attend the Games as spectators. A spectator pass gives access to the opening ceremony and sport events. No one will be admitted to a Games site who is not wearing an approved credential. To register as a spectator, you will use the same website as when registering your teen. Please note registration and fee deadlines, be aware of early bird prices.

While we encourage families to consider attending to support their teens, the athletes have programs and activities going on for the entirety of their time at the Games and thus only see visitor's courtside at sporting events. At no point during the week can spectators or parents remove the teens from the program or take them off-site for any reason.
