

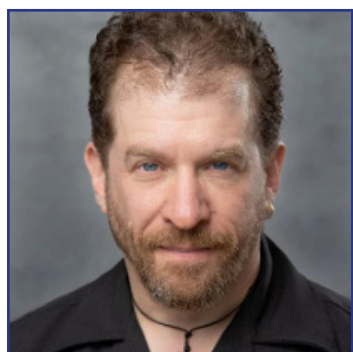
# LEO DWORSKY & FRIENDS

Leo Dworsky, a Minnesota native, is a first-year Master of Sacred Music student in the Cantorial School at the Jewish Theological Seminary, where his work is rooted in a deep passion for music and community building. He currently serves as a Cantorial Intern at Temple Emanuel of the Pascack Valley in Woodcliff Lake, NJ, and previously earned a Bachelor of Music in Vocal Performance and Jewish Studies from the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities. Leo has performed with a range of opera companies, orchestras, and media outlets, appearing in multiple operatic roles and earning recognition as a featured artist and scholarship recipient.
